Page x, Latin short vowels chart	<i>Rectus</i> has a long <i>e</i> and thus cannot be used as the example for a short <i>e</i> .	Change example to: <b>ventus</b> : wind <i>wen-tus</i>
Page xii	The pronunciation of <i>rēgīna</i> in the ecclesiastical pronunciation table is incorrect.	Change to: re-jeen-ah
Page xii	The pronunciation of the diphthong <i>oe</i> is incorrect.	Change to: as in stray
Page 14, note beneath #6	<i>Nārro</i> is missing a macron.	Change to: <i>nārrō</i>
Page 28, Figure 4-2	<i>Puelos</i> is incorrect for the accusative plural.	Change to: <i>puellās</i>
Page 73, Sentence Building exercise	There were errors with the subject/verb agreement in this exercise, in both the Latin sentences and the English translations. Page 140, verb chart	It should not say “Latin Tense” as the header for the first column (1st person, 2nd person, etc.).	Remove “Latin Tense” header from column 1
Page 145, Accusative-Case Endings chart	The column headers are incorrect.	Column 2 header should be Second Declension and column 3 header should be Second Declension (N).
Page 208, C. Apply	<i>Rectus</i> should have a macron on the <i>e</i>	Change to: <i>rēctus</i>
Pages 219, 223, 226, 232	The future and imperfect headings are switched in the chant table.	Switch the future and imperfect chant table headers (just the headers, nothing else).
Pages 203, 207, 209	The order of the chant chart should be present, imperfect, future to match the order of all of the other chant charts with three tenses.	Switch the order of the imperfect and future columns so that future comes third, not second.
Pages 153, 261, 266 (Student Edition) Pages 157, 159, 169, 236 (Answer Key)	Expand definition of <i>clārus</i>	Change definition of <i>clārus</i> to: clear, famous

Page 40, Chapter 7, Answer Key, bottom of page	The three answers are missing from this page.	Should be: 2. <i>Dominus stat.</i> The master stands. 3. <i>Amīcae stant.</i> The friends stand. 4. <i>Servī labōrant.</i> The slaves work.
Page 67, Chapter 11, Answer Key, Exercise B	Accusative Plural Feminine ending: -as	Change to: -ās
Page 87, Chapter 14, Answer Key, Exercise A, #10	The answer is incorrect.	<i>Nautae</i> (nom.) is genitive singular, dative singular. The answer should be "sailors, of the sailor, or to the sailor."
Page 110, Chapter 17, Exercise A, #4	The word <i>stabānt</i> is incorrectly parsed as 3/S/I.	Changed the parsing label for <i>stabānt</i> to: 3/P/I
Page 117, Chapter 19, Vocabulary	<i>Humus</i> , -ī is listed incorrectly as a masculine 2nd declension noun.	<i>Humus</i> , -ī is a feminine 2nd declension noun.
Page 131, Chapter 21, Answer Key, Exercise A., #10	The Answer Key gives "I was" as the answer for <i>silva</i> .	"forest" should be the answer for <i>silva</i>
Page 192, Chapter 31, Answer Key, bottom of page	The example translates <i>adeunt</i> as "approach" while the Answer Key uses "go in."	"The farmers go in" should say "The farmers approach"

Pages 9, 13 (Answers), 15 (Answers), 19 (Answers), 29 (Answers), 77 (Answers), 211 (Answers)	The English translation for <i>patria</i> is incomplete.	Added ", country" after "fatherland."
Page 65	Footnote missing	Added footnote: * <i>gn</i> in Latin is pronounced like the <i>ngn</i> in the English word <i>hangnail</i> .
Page 110, #4	The Nom/S/N label over <i>magna</i> is incorrect.	Should be: Nom/P/N
Page 127, Chapter 20 Quiz	In Review vocabulary, <i>habeō</i> , <i>habēre</i> , <i>habuī</i> , <i>habitum</i> is translated to "I hold..."	The translation should be "I have, to have, I had, had"

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Page 133, Chapter 21 Quiz, Exercise E	The parsing answers are missing from the answer key for section E of the quiz.	Should be parsed as follows: 1. Agricola: Nom/S/M equum: Acc/S/M exercet: 3/S/Pr 2. Magister: Nom/S/M est: 3/S/Pr iratus: Nom/S/M
Page 133, Chapter 21, Excercise E	A note should be added to the Answer Key regarding <i>Agricola</i> in the first question of exercise E.	Added an asterisk next to the parsing label for <i>Agricola</i> and add the following note in the Answer Key: <i>Agricola</i> is one of the four masculine nouns of the 1st declension. See chapter 14.
Pages 194 (Answers), 228	The English translation for <i>patria</i> is incorrect.	Replaced "native land" with "fatherland, country"
